




Drexel ROTC Hall of Fame Induction of John McGarrigle

Start practicing for next year, as we hope to add some new faces to the mix.
















ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT BILL BERGMAN

Bill Bergman, EK 274, graduated from Drexel in 1954 from the College of Business Administration. His Fraternity Life as a Lambda Chi began as a freshman at the 3507 Baring St house in 1949. He served as Rush Chair, Treasurer, and High Alpha. He expressed how the Fraternity provided him with a wonderful experience in leadership, consensus building, persistence, and the importance of the bond of brotherhood.

Bill's Drexel experience was a pivotal point in his life. At Drexel is where Bill met his wife of 61 years, Donna, a Tri-Sig, and where he landed his first co-op job that led to a career of forty years with RVI, which became part of P&G in 1985. Bill retired in 1990 as President of Richardson-Vicks and a P&G Vice-President.

His business experiences led him through all parts of the business spectrum, ranging from accounting and finance, to marketing, and then general management, which included assignments in Philadelphia, New York, Paris, and lastly in Connecticut, the RVI headquarters. The experiences were varied and many, all making him appreciate how important his time at Drexel was.

He and his wife finally settled fulltime in their vacation state of Arizona, but will always consider themselves as easterners. Their four children and nine grandchildren continue to keep them busy.

If all brothers donated, the Alumni Association could fund a great annual program including education/ scholarships and events, and the House Corporation could fund necessary repairs/upgrades to the house.


Funds Contributed Through Drexel

Since we returned to campus, we manage the fraternity house under an agreement with Drexel which requires us to contract our major repairs with Drexel approved vendors. Funds contributed through Drexel:

 - i. Drexel counts this donation as a donation made directly to Drexel.
- c. Fund educational and capital projects.
